



Mr. Fergal O' Regan

Fergal O' Regan (born Ireland, 1968) is Head of Unit at the European Ombudsman. The European Ombudsman carries out inquiries in relation to allegations of maladministration by European institutions and agencies. As Head of Unit, Mr O' Regan manages a team of lawyers that conducts inquiries on behalf of the Ombudsman. Mr O' Regan has been responsible for managing approximately 500 Ombudsman inquiries, including numerous access to documents cases (for example, Roacutane, Port of Granadilla, Medicines Agency Audits, Antidumping files), procedural rights cases (for example, Early Warning System, Intel and the PIP case) and environmental law cases (for example, Malagrotta Landfill)

Mr O' Regan has a Masters Degree in European Law from the College of Europe, Bruges and law degrees from the Université d'Aix-Marseille and the Universidad de Deusto, Bilbao. He is also qualified in economics from the Universidad de Deusto. He has been admitted to the Bar in Bilbao and Brussels.

Prior to joining the Ombudsman's services in 2006, he worked at a major Brussels-based law firm for over eight years, specialising in EU competition law.

Apart from his work with the European Ombudsman, Mr O' Regan is currently a Visiting Professor at the College of Europe, Bruges. He also gives lectures in a number of other third level institutes on matters concerning the work of the Ombudsman and on EU law in general. He has also been Chair of the Brussels Branch of the Institute of International and European Affairs (the IIEA).
